- 1. Abhay Krishna has been appointed as head of Indian Army's crucial Eastern Command.
- 2. American Sioftware Major Adobe Systems appointed Shanmugh Natarajan as Chief of India Operations.
- 3. Arbind Modi and Bajrang Dass Vishnoi appointed as members of Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT). CBDT is headed by a chairman (Currently Sushil Chandra) and can have max 6 members.
- 4. Axis Bank re-appointed Shikha Sharma as MD & CEO of Axis Bank for another 3 year term starting June 2018 as Her current term is coming to an end in June 2018.
- 5. Board of Control for Cricket in India's CAC (Cricket Advisory Committee) named former Indian Cricketer Ravi Shastri as new chief coach of Indian cricket team till ICC World Cup 2019.
- 6. Brenda Marjorie Hale has been appointed as first female president of UK's Supreme Court, top Judicial Post in UK.
- 7. Britain's first woman Sikh MP Preet Kaur Gill has been elected to Home Affairs Select Committee in UK Parliament.
- 8. Carrie Lam appointed as first female Chief Executive (CE) of Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) of China.
- 9. Debi Prasad Dash has been appointed as Director General of Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DG-DRI).
- 10. Gopal Prasad Parajuli has been appointed as new Chief Justice of Nepal.
- 11. Government appointed Mukesh Kumar Jain as Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer of Oriental Bank of Commerce.
- 12. Government named Election Commissioner Achal Kumar Joti as next Chief Election Commissioner of India, to take charge on July 6. He will succeed Nasim Zaidi.
- 13. Indian Origin Person Subra Suresh from IIT Madras has been chosen as President of Nanyang Technological University (NTU) in Singapore.
- 14. Japanese auto major Nissan appointed Thomas Kuehl as president of its Indian operations.
- 15. John Joseph has been appointed as Director General of Goods and Services Tax Intelligence (DG GSTI), A key intelligence agency tasked with checking evasion of Goods and Services Tax (GST).
- 16. K K Venugopal has been appointed as new (15th) Attorney General of India.
- 17. Khaltmaa Battulga has been appointed as President of Mongolia.
- 18. Lord Mervyn Davies has been appointed as Chairman of UK India Business Council (UKIBC).
- 19. M. Venkaiah Naidu Resigned as Minister of Housing and Urban Affairs after his name has been put up for Vice president elections to be held on Aug 05, 2017. - 20. Mahesh Senanayake has appointed as New Army Chief of Neighbouring Nation Sri Lanka.
- 21. Naga People's Front (NPF)'s TR Zeliang has been sworn in as 19th chief minister of Nagaland.
- 22. National Democratic Alliance (NDA) nominee Ram Nath Kovind has been elected as 14th President of India, getting almost twice votes as his opponent Meira Kumar. He is second Dalit after KR Narayanan to get appointed as President of India and first President from Uttar Pradesh. Sanjay Kothari has been appointed as Secretary to President elect Ram Nath Kovind.
- 23. Nitish Kumar took oath as Chief Minister of Bihar for 6th Time, a day after he had resigned from the same post amid political turmoil.
- 24. Pradeep Kumar Rawat is appointed as Indian Ambassador to Indonesia.
- 25. RP Sanjiv Goenka is named as Chairman of Board of Governors at IIT-Kharagpur.
- 26. Rajkiran Rai G assumed charge as MD & CEO of Union Bank of India and Melwyn Rego assumed charge as MD & CEO of Syndicate Bank.
- Additionally, Kewal Handa has been appointed as non-executive chairman of Union Bank of India.
- 27. Ram Nath Kovind has been sworn in as 14th president of India. Sanjay Kothari has been appointed as Secretary to President.

- 36. Subhash Chandra Garg (*Secretary in Department of Economic Affairs*) has been appointed as India's Alternate Governor on Board of Governors of Asian Development Bank (ADB).

- 3. GST Council formed a Selection Committee under Chairmanship of Cabinet Secretary (*Currently Pradeep Kumar Sinha*) to recommend eligible persons for appointment as Chairman and Members of National Anti-profiteering Authority (NAPA) under GST. NAPA ensures that full benefits of a reduction in tax on supply of goods or services flow to consumers.
- 4. Karnataka Government constituted a committee to study possibility of designing a separate state flag and providing it a statutory standing.
- 5. Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology constituted a Committee under Chairmanship of B N Srikrishna (Former SC Judge) to study and identify key data protection issues and recommend methods for addressing them as Protection of Data is expected to provide big boost to Digital economy of the country.

- 4. July 11 World Population Day. 2017 theme is Family Planning- Empowering People, Developing Nations.

- Punjab government signed MoU with Foundation for Innovative New Diagnostics (FIND), global diagnostic firm to help state diagnose and treat Hepatitis C patients.
- 12. July 29 International Tiger Day (also Global Tiger Day). 2017's theme is Fresh Ecology For Tigers' Protection.
- India has 70 % of world's tigers with approx 2,226 tigers in India in 2014. There are 50 tiger reserves in India which are governed by *Project Tiger*, administered by National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA). Karnataka has most tigers in India (approx 410), followed by Uttarakhand (approx 350).
- 13. July 3 International Plastic Bag Free Day.
- 14. July 30 United Nations (UN) World Day against Trafficking in Persons. 2017 theme is *Act to Protect and Assist Trafficked Persons*.
- 15. July 6 World Zoonoses Day. Zoonoses are viral diseases like rabies and influenza, bacterial diseases such as Lyme disease and brucellosis, or parasitic diseases such as tapeworms.
- 16. Malala Day. Declared by UN in 2013 on occasion of Malala Yousafzai's Birthday. She is a Pakistani girl engaged in the promotion of women's education and rights.

Defence

- 1. 14 day long joint military exercise Maitree 2017 between Indian and Thailand Armies commenced in Himachal Pradesh.
- 2. Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) launched ut Muntra (Mission UNmanned TRAcked) as India's first unmanned, remotely operated tank at its Chennai lab. It has been launched in 3 variants Muntra-S, Muntra-M and Muntra-N for surveillance, mine detection and reconnaissance in areas with nuclear and biological threats.

- 3. Government has empowered Army to directly procure critical weapons systems and military platforms to maintain combat readiness for short duration intense wars.
- It was needed as Army is facing severe shortage in ammunition, mainly for artillery guns, air defence, tanks and certain infantry weapons.
- Under new scheme, Vice Chief of Army has been given full financial powers to procure ammunitions.
- 4. India, Japan and USA navies completed 2017 MALABAR trilateral naval Exercise near Chennai in Bay of Bengal. This is 21st edition of Malabar naval exercise.
- 5. Indian Army signed MoU with Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) to raise 5 regiments of advanced Medium Range Surface to Air Missiles (MRSAM) with 60 Missiles. MRSAM air defence system can shoot down enemy missiles, aircraft at range of over 50 km. It is land-based variant of long-range surface-to-air missile (LRSAM) or Barak-8 naval air defence system.
- 6. Indian Navy's second LCU (landing craft utility) Mark IV L52 ship built by Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers Limited (GRSE) Kolkata has been launched. These vessels are designed for multipurpose amphibious operations carried out Indian Navy and Army to ensure maritime security of Andamans and Lakshadweep islands.
- 7. New Naval Offshore Patrol Vessels Shachi and Shruti launched at Pipavav Shipyard in Gujarat. These are first set of warships that have been manufactured by a private defence sector entity Reliance Defence and Engineering Limited.

Economy

- 1. 36th National Bank For Agriculture & Rural Development (NABARD) Foundation Day and Silver Jubilee of SHG Bank Linkage Programme held in New Delhi. Self Help Group Bank Linkage Programme (SHG BLP) is a Financial Inclusion initiative of NABARD
- 2. According to 2nd National Council of Applied Economic Research (NCAER) State Investment Potential Index (N-SIPI 2017) report -
- Gujarat retained top position in list of 21 states and UTs with most investment potential, followed by Delhi and Andhra Pradesh.
- 3. According to Asian Development Bank, India will achieve GDP growth rate of 7.4 % in 2017-18 and 7.6 % in 2018-19
- 4. According to BMI Research, India is expected to register a growth of 6.9% in financial year 2017-18. While RBI predicted 7.3 % GDP Growth Rate for current fiscal year (2017-18).
- BMI Research was founded in 1984 by Business Monitor International and was acquired by Fitch Group later in 2014.
- 5. Aiming to eliminate all subsidies by March 2018, Government ordered oil companies to raise subsidised cooking gas, LPG prices by 4 rupees per cylinder every month.
- 6. Axis Bank acquired digital payment platform FreeCharge in an all-cash deal valued at INR 385 Crores.
- Freecharge was founded in 2010 and was sold to Snapdeal in 2015 for USD 400 Million.
- 7. Axis Bank has entered into a collaboration with Inter-American Investment Corporation (IIC) to facilitate trade with Latin America and Caribbean. Axis Bank became first Indian bank to participate in the Trade Finance Facilitation Programme as a confirming bank.
- 8. Axis Bank introduced a special loan product, offering to fund up to 95 % of Bikes with engine displacement of over 500 cubic centimetres (cc).
- 9. Bank of Baroda signed agreement with Directorate General of Supplies & Disposal (DGS&D) for extending various banking services to Government e-Marketplace (GeM). e-GeM is an initiative intended to bring transparency and efficiency in public procurements.
- 10. Banking Digital Innovation firm Aurionpro Solutions launched its Branch-in-a-Box product, the Virtual Teller Machine (VTM) as a fully integrated self-service kiosk for automating 90% of banking transactions at branch level.
- 11. Banking Regulation (Amendment) Bill 2017 presented in Lok Sabha, seeking to amend Banking Regulation Act 1949 and replace Banking Regulation (Amendment) Ordinance 2017. It authorises RBI to -
- Direct banking companies to resolve the problem of stressed assets and Initiate insolvency resolution process on specific stressed assets.
- Issue other directions for resolution, appoint or approve authorities or committees to advise banking companies for stressed asset resolution. Recovery proceedings will be carried out under Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code 2016.
- 12. Canara Bank launched its first 'Digital Banking Branch' named 'CANDI' in Bengaluru, to provide end-to-end digital experience to customers.
- 13. Chhattisgarh government will merge all district cooperative central banks (DCCBs) of state into a single State Cooperative Bank, to serve farmers with better and efficient banking facilities.
- 14. China based Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) approved USD 329 million loan to build access roads to 4,000 villages in Gujarat.

- 15. Consumer Affairs Ministry amended Legal Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules 2011 (PCR), To benefit consumers and protect them from paying different prices at different locations. Rules will be known as Legal Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Amendment Rules 2017.
- In accordance with new rules to come into effect from 1 January 2018, price of packed goods would no longer depend on where the product is purchased A mall / five-star hotel / airport or a local Kirana store.
- Retail sale price of any packed product will be Maximum Retail Price (MRP) inclusive of all taxes, with provision to round off price to nearest rupee or 50 paise.
- New legal provision will make sure that no person is able to declare different MRPs on an identical pre-packed commodity, curbing possibility of any vendor charging differential prices for same product.
- e-commerce marketplaces will ensure that declarations (except month and year of manufacturing) shall be displayed on digital and electronic network used for e-commerce transactions. It include companies like Grofers and BigBasket, who stock the inventory. Other e-Commerce entities like Amazon and Flipkart who do not own an inventory, responsibility of correctness of declarations will be of manufacturer / seller / dealer / importer.
- 16. Credit rating agency ICRA launched a new system for rating of infrastructure projects in association with India Infrastructure Finance Company Ltd (IIFCL), to focus on overall recovery of dues by investor and lender over lifecycle of project.
- 17. Digital payments company MobiKwik partnered with Samsung Pay, under which consumers will be able to make payments with a single tap using select Samsung handsets.
- 18. Domestic android-based mobile operating system Indus OS partnered with YES Bank to launch OS-integrated UPI (Unified Payment Interface) payment platform in India.
- It will enable users to use UPI payment platform on SMS, dialler interface, and on third party apps like WhatsApp. It means P2P transactions, as well as utility payments, can be made via SMS or messaging.
- 19. Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) signed agreement with 4 private banks (*ICICI Bank, HDFC Bank, Axis Bank and Kotak Mahindra Bank*) and Bank of Baroda for collecting provident fund dues from employers and payments to its subscribers.
- This is the first time that EPFO has joined hands with private banks for this purpose. It will save INR 300 crores annually for EPFO as these five banks have agreed up on zero transaction charges.
- 20. FINO Payments Bank commenced operations as a payments bank.
- FINO Payments Bank is 4th entity to start functioning as a Payments Bank in India, after Airtel, India Post and Paytm.
- 21. Finance Minister Arun Jaitley released National Trade Facilitation Action Plan that gives a time bound map for implementing WTO-Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA) and also includes India's initiatives for trade facilitation and ease of doing business which goes beyond TFA.
- 22. GMR Goa International Airports Ltd signed a INR 1330 Crore Loan Agreement with Axis Bank, for development of Greenfield airport at Mopa.
- 23. Goods and Services Tax (GST) Came into Effect, bringing in One Nation, One Indirect Tax.
- GST simplified Indirect Taxes by abolishing set of Different Indirect Taxes at State and Central Level. Tax Slabs are 0 %, 5%, 12 %, 18% AND 28%.

- 24. Google acquired Bengaluru-based artificial intelligence startup Halli Labs for an undisclosed sum, founded by Pankaj Gupta in 2017 (4 months into operations).
- 25. Government Launched *Aaykar Setu* as a new tax payer service module, To enhance mobile access experience for Taxpayers.
- It is aimed at reducing physical interface between assesses and tax assessing authorities and thereby minimizing chances of any tax harassment.
- The module compiles various tax tools, live chat, dynamic updates, and important links to various processes within Income Tax Department in a single module.
- 26. Government Stated that Gifts up to a value of Rs 50,000 per year by an employer to his employee are outside ambit of GST. Gifts of value over INR 50000 made without consideration are subject to GST.
- 27. Government approved Labour Code on Wages Bill which will ensure a minimum wage across all sectors by integrating existing labour related laws. The Labour Code on Wages Bill consolidates the Minimum Wages Act 1948, Payment of Bonus Act 1965, Payment of Wages Act 1936 and Equal Remuneration Act 1976.
- 28. Government approved revision of guidelines of Sovereign Gold Bonds (SGB) Scheme, which is aimed at converting part of 300 tons of physical bars and coins purchased every year for Investment into 'demat' gold bonds. Mobilisation target was 15,000 crore in 2015-16 and at Rs.10,000 crore in 2016-17. But, amount credited so far in scheme's account is approx 4700 crores, triggering need for changes in guidelines.

- Specific changes in attributes of scheme to make it more attractive, mobilise more and reduce economic strains caused by imports of gold and reduce Current Account Deficit (CAD).
- Flexibility to design and introduce variants of SGBs has been given to Ministry of Finance.
- Investment limit per fiscal year has been increased to 4 kg for individuals, 4 Kg for Hindu Undivided Family (HUF) and 20 Kg for Trusts and similar entities.
- 29. Government approved selling government's entire 51.11% stake in Hindustan Petroleum Corp Ltd to Oil and Natural Gas Corp.
- Government is 51% owner of HPCL and 68% owner of ONGC. HPCL's addition will make ONGC third-largest refiner in country after IOC and Reliance Industries.
- 30. Government exempted import of aircraft, aircraft engines and its parts via leasing route from the purview of Goods and Services Tax (GST), providing relief to aviation industry as it was facing dual levy of 5 % at import and another 5 % at the time of payment of lease rent.
- 31. Government has set up Directorate General of Analytics and Risk Management (DGARM) as a new wing to provide intelligence inputs taking action against tax evaders. It has been has been set up will be under the Central Board of Excise and Customs (CBEC). DGARM was set up on 1 July 2017, coinciding with rollout of Goods and Services Tax (GST).
- 32. Government imposed 10% basic customs duty (BCD) on Cellular mobile phones and specified parts of cellular mobile phones like charger, battery, wire headset, Microphone and Receiver, Key Pad, USB Cable etc.
- 33. Government launched *GST Rates Finder* appn to verify accurate tax rate on commodity and services under Goods and Services Tax (GST) regime.
- 34. Government lowered interest rate on small saving schemes by 0.1 % for July- September quarter. However, Interest on savings deposits has been retained at 4 % annually. New Rates are -
- PPF 7.8%
- KVP (Kisan Vikas Patra) 7.5% (mature in 115 months)
- Sukanya Samriddhi 8.3%
- Five-year Senior Citizens Savings Scheme 8.3%
- 35. Government saved around INR 57,000 crore in 2016-17 through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) scheme under which subsidies are given directly to beneficiaries.
- In 2017-18, beneficiary base rose from 10.71 crore in 2013-14 to 35.62 crore. Total of 485 schemes have been identified for DBT.
- LPG subsidy scheme 'Pahal' alone accounted for Rs 29,769 crore savings, followed by 14,000 crores savings in Public Distribution System (PDS).
- 36. Home Ministry will examine Structure and Operations of Goods and Service Tax Network (GSTN) before giving it security clearance.
- GSTN is IT backbone of Goods and Service Tax (GST). It is a not for profit and private limited company incorporated in 2013.
- Government holds 24.5% equity in GSTN. It has been set up primarily to provide IT infrastructure and services to the Central and State Governments, tax payers and other stakeholders for implementation of Goods and Services Tax (GST).
- 37. ICICI Bank will be selling personal loans of up to Rs 15 lakh through its ATMs. Using data from credit information companies, ICICI Bank will pre-qualify select customers for personal loans. Such customers will get a message on ATM screen after completing a transaction, informing about their eligibility for personal loans. Such customers can avail 5 year personal loan of upto Rs 15 lakh and amount will be credited instantly to their account.
- 38. India signed \$220 million loan agreement with Asian Development Bank (ADB) for improving connectivity as well as transport efficiency and safety on State Highways of Rajasthan.
- 39. India's YES Bank received \$150 million funding from USA government and Wells Fargo to increase lending to support women entrepreneurs and small and medium-sized enterprises in India.
- 40. India's Yes Bank signed MoU with British Bank Santander to promote India-UK trade and business opportunities.
- 41. Indian Overseas Bank started offered *Bharat Bill Payment System* (*BBPS*) services introduced by National Payments Corporation of India. BBPS is an integrated bill payment system that offers inter-operable online bill payments to customers. IOB is among 4 government banks (apart from Bank of Baroda and Union Bank of India) to get approval from RBI for providing BBPS services.
- National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) recebily received final nod from Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to function as Bharat Bill Payment Central Unit and operate Bharat Bill Payment System (BBPS).
- BBPS pilot project started on 31 August, 2016 with 8 BBPS operating units, which now stands at 24 certified units.

- 42. Infosys co-founder Nandan Nilekani along with venture capitalist Sanjeev Aggarwal has launched a \$100 million venture fund called *Fundamentum* to back mid-stage startups that solve unique Indian problems in consumer technology space.
- 43. Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (IBBI) notified rules for inspection and investigation of service providers registered with it (*professional agencies, entities, professionals and information utilities*). Now, investigation authority has to serve a notice intimating entity concerned about probe at least 10 days in advance.
- 44. International Monetary Fund (IMF)', World Economic Outlook (July 2017 Update) -
- India GDP growth rate will be 7.2% for 2017-18 (up from 7.1% in 2016-17). India's growth would accelerate to 7.7% in 2018-19. India's economy will still be the fastest growing among large economies. Worls bank also predicted 7.2 % GDP Growth rate for India in current Year and also stated that India will remain World's 4th Fastest Growing Economy.
- Global economic growth rate will be 3.5% in 2017 and 3.6% in 2018.
- China's projected to grow by 6.7% in 2017 and 6.4% in 2018.
- 45. Janalakshmi Financial Services (largest microfinance company) appointed Ajay Kanwal as its New CEO. JFS has been gearing up for launch of their Small finance bank.
- 46. Karnataka Bank in association with PNB MetLife launched *Met Loan and Life Suraksha (MLLS)* as a single premium plan covering loan liability of a customer.
- 47. Karnataka Bank launched *KBL-Image Debit Card*, that will enable its cardholders to personalise their Debit card with an image of his/her choice.
- 48. Kolkata based *Srei Infrastructure Finance* signed MoU with Russia's Vnesheconombank to create a \$200 million IT and Innovation Fund.
- 49. Lok Sabha passed Companies (Amendment) Bill 2016 to amend Companies Act 2013, to strengthen corporate governance standards, initiate strict action against defaulting companies and help improve the ease of doing business in India. Threshold for easy compliance scheme has been raised to Rs 100 crore from Rs 20 crore, making more companies eligible for simple compliance regime.
- 50. Ministry of Power announced that approx 97% of outstanding debt of all state power distribution companies (approx 3.95 lakh crores) has been covered under the Ujwal DISCOM Assurance Yojana (UDAY).
- As of now, 26 states and 1 UT which have joined UDAY scheme, accounting for total outstanding debt of Rs. 3.82 lakh
- 51. National Multi Commodity Exchange (NMCE) will merge with Indian Commodity Exchange (ICEX) to form India's third biggest commodity exchange.
- This is first merger in commodity exchange space in India. In merged entity, ICEX will hold 62.8% stake and NMCE will own the rest.
- New exchange will offer a wide range of contracts and will also offer world's first diamond futures contract, which has already received approval from SEBI.
- 52. Private life insurance company *Canara HSBC Oriental Bank of Commerce Life Insurance* signed bancassurance agreement with Kerala-based Dhanlaxmi Bank, for marketing its various life insurance products to Bank's customers.
- As name depicts, Canara HSBC Oriental Bank of Commerce Life Insurance is Joint venture of Canara Bank, HSBC and Oriental Bank of Commerce.
- 53. Punjab National Bank (PNB) and Bajaj Allianz General Insurance have signed an agreement for the distribution of insurance products through the branches (*Bancassurance*).
- 54. Punjab National Bank (PNB) will block all Maestro debit cards from 31st of July 2017 if card holders do not replace it with a more secure EMV chip based card by end of July.
- 55. RBI imposed penalty of Rs. 3 crore on Union Bank of India for non-compliance with directions on Know Your Customer (KYC) norms.
- 56. RBI issued revised directions on Customer Protection in case of authorised / failed online Transactions -
- It aims at Limiting Liability of Customers in unauthorised Electronic Banking Transactions.
- In cases of negligence caused by the customer by sharing of payment credentials, the customer is liable to bear the entire loss.
- Customers will be entitled to zero liability when authorised transaction occurs due to contributory fraud/negligence/deficiency on part of bank irrespective of whether or not unauthorised transaction has been reported by customer.
- If Fault is at Third Party End -
- If customer reports to bank within 3 days All amount involved will be credited to their accounts within 10 days by bank.
- If customer reports to bank within 3 7 days All Amount or INR 25000 (whicheever is less) within 10 days by bank.

- If customer reports to bank after 7 days as per bank's policy.
- 57. Reliance Industries Limited (RIL) for the first time crossed Rs 5 lakh crore in market capitalisation. RIL is second firm to cross Rs 5 lakh crore in market capitalisation and is also currently most valued company in India. Tata Consultancy Service (TCS) was first company to hit Rs 5 lakh crore in market capitalisation milestone in July 2014.
- 58. Reserve Bank of India (RBI) allowed non-banking finance companies (NBFCs) to sell and market new pension scheme (NPS). Profit Making NBFCs with asset size of Min 500 crores are now permitted to sell NPS after registration with pension regulator.
- 59. Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has set up Supervisory Colleges for 6 Scheduled Commercial Banks which have sizeable international presence State Bank of India, ICICI Bank., Bank of India, Bank of Baroda, Axis Bank and Punjab National Bank.
- 60. Reserve Bank of India will shortly issue bank notes of denomination Rs 20 in Mahatma Gandhi series 2005 with inset letter 'S'.
- 61. SBI (State Bank of India) slashed interest rates given on savings bank accounts from 4 % to 3.5 % on deposits below Rs. 1 crore.
- 62. Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI) started merchant banking operations to benefit expanding number of growth-oriented micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs), especially those with a strong technology and innovation quotient.

 65. State Bank of India (SBI) launched SBI Realty as a dedicated portal to help home buyers to choose flats from its 3,000
- approved projects across country (over 9.5 Lakh Home Units). 66. State Bank of India Online Funds Transfer Fee Rates Reduced

- 68. Travel Bookings Firm *Yatra* acquired corporate travel service provider Air Travel Bureau (ATB, India's *largest corporate travel services provider*.
- 69. United Forum of Bank Unions observed July 19 (48th anniversary of nationalization of major banks) as 'Save public sector banks' day.
- 70. YES Bank launched YES GST program for MSMEs (Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises) to help them get familiar with GST taxation system.

- Doko-La region lies at tri-junction of India, China and Bhutan. Tensions esclated when China started Building a strategic road in this region which is claimed by Bhutan as its territory. Both countries have deployed around 3,000 troops each in region.
- This area has huge strategic significance for both India and China as it is in close proximity of sensitive Chicken's Neck (Siliguri Corridor), the extremely narrow stretch of land that connects north-eastern region to the rest of India.
- India-China Border disputes-
- India and China share approx 3,488 km border Western sector, Middle sector, and Eastern sector. 5 Indian states Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Sikkim and Arunachal Pradesh share border with China.
- Western Sector India shares about 2152 km long border with China, between Jammu and Kashmir and Xinjiang Province of China. In this sector, there is territorial dispute over Aksai Chin region that was resaon for Sino- Indian war in 1962.
- During British Empire, 2 borders between India and China were proposed Johnson's Line and McDonald Line. Johnson's line (proposed in 1865) shows Aksai Chin under India's control whereas McDonald Line (proposed in 1893) places it under China's control.
- Middle sector It is approx 625 km long boundary with states of Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand. It does carry kuch disputes.
- Eastern Sector It is 1,140 km long boundary that runs from eastern limit of Bhutan to a point near the Talu Pass at the trijunction of Tibet, India and Myanmar, called McMahon Line. China considers McMahon Line illegal and claims India's Arunachal Pradesh as its territory.
- 42. India and Bangladesh signed pact to connect both countries by waterways, for better movement of passengers and goods.
- 43. India and Bangladesh will construct a bridge over Mizoram's Khawthlangtuipui river (also known as Karnaphuli river) to improve trade and communication.
- 44. India and European Union (EU) have established Investment Facilitation Mechanism (IFM) for EU Investments in India. It will help in identifying and solving problems faced by EU companies and investors with regard to their operations in India.
- 45. India and Pakistan will hold talks on 2 hydrpower projects Kishenganga and Ratle, under 1960 Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) at World Bank headquarters in Washington (USA). Water Resources Secretary Amarjit Singh will lead Indian delegation during talks.

- 46. India and Sri Lanka signed MoU to develop a village in Anuradhapura District in Sri Lanka at cost of 30 crore Sri Lankan rupees. Village is in name of famous Buddhist monk Sobitha Thero.
- India also recently launched a solar project to electrify a remote village in Egypt named Agaween.
- 47. India contributed USD 500,000 to the UN Peacebuilding Fund, expressing hope that more funding by nations will boost efforts by world body to build and sustain peace.
- 48. India contributed additional \$1 million to India-UN Development Partnership Fund launched to support sustainable development projects across the developing world.
- Earlier, India contributed \$1 million when the fund was created on 9 June 2017 (on World Oceans Day 2017) as a partnership between India and United Nations Office for South-South Cooperation (UNOSSC).
- 49. India for first time will import crude oil from USA, as agreed upon during recent visit of PM Narendra Modi to USA.
- Indian Oil Corp bought 1.6 million barrels of US Mars crude (a heavy, high-sulphur grade) and 400,000 barrels of Western Canadian Select that will be delivered onboard a Very Large Crude Carrier.
- 50. India granted aid of USD 500000 to Philippines for rehabilitation and relief efforts in war-torn Marawi City and confronting ISIS. It is first time that India is sending financial aid to another country affected by terrorism.
- 51. India will soon join Global Foreign Exchange Committee (GFXC), a newly-constituted forum of central bankers and experts working towards promotion of a robust and transparent foreign exchange (Forex) market. It has been set up under guidance of the Bank for International Settlements (BIS). GFXC was established in London during a meeting in May 2017.
- 52. India's first high-speed rail training center will be functional in Gandhinagar (Gujarat) by 2020. It is Being constructed over land measuring 4,400 metres at cost of approx INR 600 crores. It will enable testing of bullet trains that will run on Mumbai- Ahmedabad route by 2023.
- 53. India-Japan civil nuclear deal came into force, enabling Japan to export nuclear power plant technology as well as provide finance for nuclear power plants in India. It will also assist India in Other nuclear energy activities.
- 54. Indonesia banned Islamic organization Hizb-ut Tahrir under a contraversial presidential decree, to safeguard existence of Its pluralist state ideology Pancasila and 1945 Constitution.
- Hizb ut-Tahrir has been banned as it compaigns for country to adopt Islamic law and become a caliphate0, that is against Indonesia's unity.
- 55. Indonesia named waters in its exclusive economic zone that overlap with China's expansive claim to South China Sea as *North Natuna Sea*. Part of the renamed area falls in China's *nine-dash line* waters extending to south and east of China's island province Hainan.
- 56. International body Financial Stability Board (FSB) has placed India in league of countries that are *compliant or largely compliant* on implementation of priority area reforms, in FSB reform report card to G20.
- Report listed India as *compliant* with regard to Basel III reforms in risk-based capital and *largely compliant* on liquidity coverage ratio.
- 57. International food standards-setting body *Codex Alimentarius Commission* adopted three Codex standards for black, white and green pepper, cumin and thyme, paving way for universal agreement on identifying quality spices in various countries.
- The member-countries CAC met in Geneva for its 40th session. Codex standards for spices were adopted after India's efforts for the same. Spices have now been included for the first time as commodities with such universal standards.
- 58. Iran and Iraq signed MoU to step up military cooperation and the fight against terrorism and extremism. It is valuable as Iraq has been badly affected by terrorism over past few years and Iran has been under international scanner due to is Nuclear weapons program.
- 59. Iran successfully launched its most advanced satellite-carrying rocket called 'Simorgh' into space, capable of carrying a satellite weighing 250 kilograms (550 pounds).
- 60. Italy passed a bill making torture a crime under national law, making torture punishable by 4 10 years in prison and 12 years for members of security forces.
- 61. Lulu Exchange (a foreign exchange and remittance company set up Kerala based Businessman Yusuff Ali) has acquired Al Falah Exchange Company in UAE for INR 95 crores.
- 62. MOUs Signed -
- With Palestine on cooperation in field of Health and Medicine, Information Technology and Electronics.
- With Germany on cooperation in field of Health.
- With Bangladesh for cyber security cooperation.
- 63. NASA launched Terrier-Improved Malemute sounding rocket that created colourful artificial clouds visible in skies. Rocket during 8-minute flight had released 10 canisters about the size of a soft drink into space. Canisters deployed blue-green and red vapour that formed artificial clouds visible in the skies of USA.

- 64. NASA's Langley Research Centre (LRC) completed 100 years of its establishment. It has so far contributed exceptionally in the way astronauts fly, explore space and how they study Earth.
- 65. NATO military exercise in Eastern Europe held in Bulgaria with 25,000 military personnel from over 20 partner countries.
- 66. Neil Armstrong's bag containing approx 500 gm moon dust has been sold at an auction for USD 1.8 million in New york (USA), to an anonymous buyer.
- 67. Nepal SBI Bank, a subsidiary of State Bank of India launched its fully automatic digital banking services in Nepalese capital Kathmandu, called sbiINTOUCH. This is first time that State Bank of India has expanded paperless banking system outside India.
- 68. North Korea successfully test-fired its first intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) Hwasong-14 into Sea of Japan. It is North Korea's most successful missile test since its ballistic missile programme gathered pace in 1990s.
- To qualify as an ICBM, a missile must have a minimum range of 5,500km.
- 69. One of biggest icebergs ever recorded has broken away from Larsen C Ice Shelf of Antarctica that covers area of roughly 6000 square kilometres.
- 70. Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development's (OECD) Government at a Glance 2017 report -
- India topped The List, indicating that PM Narendra Modi led NDA coalition Government has gained highest trust in world among its people, with score of 73%.
- Top 5 India (73 %) Canada (62%), Turkey (58%), Russia (58 %) and Germany (55%). US government secured only 30% of peoples' confidence.
- Greece has been placed at bottom of list with score of 13%.
- Number of government jobs as share of total employment remained 18.1% in 2015, compared to 17.9% in 2007. Highest (30%) Government employment is in Denmark.
- 71. PM Narendra Modi Visited Israel -
- It is First Visit of an Indian Head of State to Israel Since Indian Independence. This visit also marks 25 years of establishment of diplomatic relationship between India and Israel.
- 7 Important MOUs Signed -
- To help grow business relationship between both countries, \$40 million Israel India Innovation Initiative Fund (I4F) has been launched.
- Conservation of water in India
- State Water Utility Reform in India India-Israel Development Cooperation- 3-year work program in Agriculture (2018-2020)
- Cooperation in atomic clocks
- Cooperation in GEO-LEO optical link.
- Cooperation in electric propulsion for small satellites.

- 74. Russia asked 755 US diplomats to leave after USA approved sanctions against Russia for allegedly meddling in 2016 US Presidential election and for its annexation of Crimea in 2014.
- 75. Saudi Arabia approved physical education program at girl's schools. Program will be complaint with stringent Islamic rules and will be implemented in 2017-2018 school year.
- 76. Second Global Cybersecurity Index (GCI) by UN telecommunications agency International Telecommunication Union (ITU) -
- This Report measures commitment of nations to cyber security.
- India has been ranked well at 23rd position out of 165 nations.
- Top 5 Singapore (1st), USA (2nd), Malaysia (3rd), Oman (4th), Estonia (5th).
- Equatorial Guinea is the worst performer among all nations with a score of zero.
- 77. Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) signed MoU with European Securities and Markets Authority (ESMA) for exchange of information concerning Central Counterparties (CCPs) under European Markets Infrastructure Regulation (EMIR).

- 78. South American Nation Bolivia's President Eva Morales declared that his nation has achieved *total independence* from IMF and World Bank.
- 79. Sri Lanka signed a US \$1.1 billion deal to sell a 70% stake of Hambantota port (*A deep-water port in the southern tip of Sri Lanka*) to China's China Merchants Port Holding Co. (CMPort) Under a 99-year lease agreement. CMPort will be only responsible for commercial operations, while SLPA will handle port's operations, security and services.
- 80. Standard Chartered Bank launched a Multi-currency Forex Card for overseas travelers. The card will allow customers to load up to 20 widely used currencies on 1 card with an online reload facility during overseas travel.
- 81. Typhoon Haitang struck China's eastern Fujian Province with continual rain blows on different parts of the region.
- 82. US Navy commissioned world's largest aircraft carrier USS Gerald R Ford.
- USS Gerald R. Ford is named after 38th President of USA Gerald Ford and is built by Newport News Ship Building Company.
- This massive 1,106-foot-long carrier displaces 100,000 tons fully loaded and is powered by 2 new generation nuclear reactors.
- 83. USA Navy tested world's first-ever active Laser Weapons System (LaWS), aborad USS Ponce amphibious transport ship. LaWS operates within an invisible part of electromagnetic spectrum and absolutely silent and incredibly effective.
- 84. USA and Australia jointly test-fired a hypersonic missile capable of moving at a speed 8 times faster than sound as part of a \$54- million research project Hypersonic International Flight Research Experimentation Program (HIFIRE).
- 85. USA imposed new economic sanctions against Iran over its ballistic missile programme and for contributing to regional tensions. NOW, USA targeted 16 entities and individuals from Iran citing them as illicit Iranian actors or transnational criminal activity.
- 86. USA rolled out pre-approved expedited entry clearance for low-risk Indian travellers under its Global Entry programme (GEP).
- India became 11th country whose citizens are now eligible to enroll in Customs and Border Protection (CBP) initiative.
- Under this, International GEP member traveller can enter in US through automatic kiosks, rather than queueing up to clear immigration check by meeting an immigration officer at selected airports.
- 87. USA successfully tested Terminal High Altitude Area Defence (THAAD) system in Alaska by launching a ballistic missile over Pacific Ocean, after North Korea conducted an Intercontinental Ballistic Missile (ICBM) test that could possibly hit USA.
- 88. USA urged other members of Nuclear Suppiers Group to support India's membership bid to NSG that controls international nuclear trade.
- 89. United Nations selected Dubai (UAE) as data hub for Middle East North Africa and South Asia (MENASA) region, due to city's integrated initiatives to mine and manage its data.
- 90. United States House of Representatives passed an amendment to National Defense Authorisation Act (NDAA), 2018, a \$621.5 billion defence expenditure bill to advance defence cooperation with India.
- 91. Vietnam granted India's ONGC Videsh a 2 year extension to explore oil block 128 in South China Sea.
- Part of the oil block 128 is in U-shaped 'nine-dash line,' which is claimed by China. This area is also route for over \$5 trillion in trade every year and is also claimed by Philippines, Brunei, Malaysia and Taiwan.
- 92. Women Entrepreneur (WE) Cities Index 2017 study released by Dell -
- India's Bengaluru ranked 40th out of 50 cities and Delhi ranked 49th.
- Top 5 New York (USA), Bay Area (US), London (UK), Boston (US) and Stockholm (Sweden).
- 93. World Bank stated that India is emerging as a frontrunner in fight against climate change, replacing coal energy with solar power as a source of energy. World Bank observed that India has made sweeping commitment to solar power and energy efficient innovative solutions to provide round the clock electricity to its people by 2030.
- 94. World Health Organization (WHO) declared end of most recent outbreak of Ebola virus disease (EVD) in African Nation Congo.
- 95. World Health Organization (WHO) relased Global Tobacco Epidemic Report 2017, stating that 63% of world's population are covered by at least one comprehensive tobacco control measure.
- 96. World's first Saola breeding centre is being built in Vietnam. 's central region for . Saola, a critically endangered hoofed mammal is identified by two parallel horns with sharp ends, which can reach 51 centimetres in length and are found on both males and females.
- 97. World's first floating windfarm has been put on trial in Scotland, to unlock ocean's potential for generating renewable power. The project is called *Hywind*, costing approx £200m. It will bring power to 20,000 homes.
- 98. World's longest pedestrian suspension bridge (*Europe Bridge*) opened in Randa (Switzerland). It measures 1,620 feet (494 Metres) long and rises as high as 278 feet above Grabengufer ravine.
- 99. World's oldest emergency helpline number 999 completed 80 years of its services in United Kingdom.

100. World's oldest emoji discovered on 3700-year-old pot in Turkey by archaelogists working on a site in Southern Turkey. The site depicts era of *Hittities*, an ancient civilisation that existed in north-central Anatolian region.

101. Writer Preeti Shenoy has been honoured with Indian of the Year Award by Brands Academy, a reputed branding company in India.

- Rajasthan Bolstering water security in villages under Mukhya Mantri Jal Swavlamban Abhiyan.
- Gujarat Enhancing adaptive capacity of natural resource dependent communities to climate change in targeted villages of Kachchh district.
- 35. Erode (Tamilnadu) based Five P Venture India and Central Silk Board (CSB) signed agreement for development and commercialization of handloom silk products.
- 36. Finance Ministry launched Pradhan Mantri Vaya Vandana Yojana (PMVVY), a pension scheme exclusively for senior citizens aged min 60 years. Under this, senior citizens will get guaranteed interest of 8% for 10 years depending upon investment made by them.
- 37. First ever Kargil International Marathon 'Run for Sarhad' concluded with over 800 runners from all over the world participating in event.
- 38. Food Safety and Authority of India (FSSAI) banned stapler pins in tea bags from January 2018, in view of safety risks.
- 39. Global Conglomerate Siemens opened its first digital factory in India in Thane, (Maharashtra). Its Siemens' third digital factory globally after one each in Germany and China.

- 40. Goa Government has set up GST facilitation centres in ward offices across state, to assist taxpayers in resolving their technical issues related to migration to GST registration, amendments, return filing and payments.
- 41. Google launched recruiting app *Hire* for small and medium sized businesses that integrates with G Suite, to compete with Microsoft-owned LinkedIn. *Hire* is an efficient app for managing recruitment prcesss from identifying talent to managing end-toend interview process.
- 42. Government Approved Inland Waterways Authority of India (IWAI)'s raising INR 660 crores in bonds for extra budgetary resources (EBRs) in 2017-18.
- 43. Government allotted INR 100 crores to Goa under phase II of Swadesh Darshan Scheme.
- 44. Government allowed Reliance Aerostructure to develop Dhirubhai Ambani Aerospace Park at Mihan SEZ in Nagpur (Maharashtra).
- 45. Government approved enhancement of age of superannuation of Medical Officers of Central Armed Police Forces and Assam Rifles from 60 to 65 years.
- 46. Government approved establishment of International Rice Research Institute (IRRI) in Varanasi (Uttar Pradesh). It will be named as IRRI South Asia Regional Centre (ISARC) and will be set up at campus of National Seed Research and Training Centre (NSRTC).
- For this purpose, Agreement has been signed between India and IRRI Philippines. Centre of Excellence in Rice Value Addition (CERVA) will be also established in Varanasi.
- 47. Government extended 2nd phase of BharatNet project that aims at covering remaining 1.50 lakh Gram Panchayats (GPS), with expenditure of Rs.42,068 crores.
- Government modified strategy of BharatNet project for providing broadband connectivity to all Gra Panchayats by March 2019.
- Government is still working on completing phase I of project for which deadline was March 2017. It was able to lay optical fibre in nearly 1 lakh GPs, however, only 22,000 GPs are provided Internet connectivity as of now due to equipment procurement issues.
- 48. Government for first time approved 3 infrastructure proposals to address infrastructure problem under Trade Infrastructure for Export Scheme (TIES). Projects are Integrated Cargo Terminal at Imphal Airport, Modernisation of infrastructure facility for marine exports in Karnataka and construction of a Standard Design Factory building at Cochin Special Economic Zone.
- TIES replaces Assistance to States for creating Infrastructure for the Development and growth of Exports (ASIDE) scheme to enhance export competitiveness by bridging gap in export infrastructure. It is being implemented from FY18 till FY20 with budgetary allocation of 600 crores.
- 49. Government has merged Ministries of *Urban development* and *Housing and urban poverty alleviation*. Merged Ministry will be known as *Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA)*. With this, Central Government now has 51 ministries.
- 50. Government laid Foundation stone of India's biggest Global Skill Park was laid in Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh). It park will come up on 37 acre land allotted in Narela Shankari area of Bhopal, with support of Singapore's Institute of Technical Education and Education Services (ITEES).
- 51. Government launched *Aarambh* Mobile App for Road Maintenance, aiming to useGIS based mapping for making road inventories, condition surveys, and producing cost estimates etc. for preparation and monitoring of annual road maintenance plans.
- 52. Government launched *Swachh Survekshan-2018* to rank all 4,041 cities and towns of country in terms of cleanliness with slogan *Swachhata Ki Jyot Jagi Hai*.
- 53. Government of Chhattisgarh has set a target of planting over eight Cr plant saplings by end of August 2017, under *Harihar Chhattisgarh* campaign.
- 54. Government released grant-in-aid of 51.3 crores to State Government of Arunachal Pradesh, for rescue and relief operations required on account of flash floods.
- 55. Government will open residential schools for scheduled caste girls in educationally backward districts. Schools will have classes from VI to XII and 70 % seats will be reserved for SC girls and remaining for Girls from BPL families in other categories.
- 56. HRD Ministry will remove no-detention policy from Right to Education Act 2009 from next academic year.
- Under this, no child is detained or held back in any class or expelled till completion of elementary education covering classes 1 to 8.
- As per records, this policy has resulted in improvement in enrollments but has brought down academic standards.
- 57. Harsimrat Kaur Badal (Minister of Food Processing Industry) laid foundation stone for First Maize (中_中) based Mega Food Park in Kapurthala (Punjab).

- 58. Haryana food and drugs administration department banned mixing of liquid nitrogen with any drink or food article, under section 34 of Food Safety and Standards Act (FSS) 2006. It came after a cocktail accident (due to mixing of liquid nitrogen in cocktail) at Gurgaon pub in April 2016 burnt a hole in a man's stomach.
- 59. Haryana government will set up a modern ornamental fish hatchery in Jhajjar district.
- 60. Health and Family Welfare Minister J P Nadda unveiled National Strategic Plan (NSP) for Malaria Elimination (2017
- 22). It has set malaria elimination deadline as 2027, three years ahead of global deadline (2030). NSP is based on 2016 National Framework for Malaria Elimination framed with support of WHO's Global Technical Strategy for Malaria, 2016 2030.
- 61. Home Minister Rajnath Singh chaired first meeting of the newly constituted Islands Development Agency (IDA) that was set up on June 01, 2017. 10 islands in Andaman & Nicobar and Lakshadweep have been identified for holistic development in first phase.
- 62. Improved Cultivation and Advanced Retting Exercise for Jute (Jute ICARE) was launched in 2015 to popularize better agronomic practices and recently developed microbial-assisted retting among farmers intensively in a few blocks in West Bengal and Assam on pilot basis. It Resulted in increase of earnings of jute farmers by over INR 10,000 per hectare
- 63. India declared itself free from Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (H5N1 and H5N8
- 64. India launched its first petroleum Research & Development (R&D) facility for testing high-end BS-VI quality fuel emissions in Faridabad (Haryana). This facility is designed to test all types of fuel products, to ensure that it meets superior BS-VI norms to be implemented by April 2020.
- 65. India will host 51-day Long 8th International Theatre Olympics in February 2018. It will be first ever Hosting of greatest carnival of theatre in world by India. It be organised by National School of Drama (NSD) and Union Culture Ministry.
- 66. India will invite 10 leaders of Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) as Chief Guests for 2018 Republic Day celebrations. Republic Day 2018 would be the first Republic Day event that will have so many leaders as the chief guests.
- 67. India's Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) partenred with with Egyptian Exchange (EGX) for cooperation in exchange of information across business areas.
- 68. India's Taj Mahal named in top 10 landmarks in world by securing fifth position in top 10 Travellers' Choice awards for Landmarks. Angkor Wat in Siem Reap (Cambodia) topped the list followed by Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque Center in Abu Dhabi (UAE).
- 69. Indian Railways launched India's first solar powered diesel multiple unit (DEMU) broad gauge train with a 1600 Horse Power (HP) Engine. Train will run from Sarai Rohilla in Delhi to Farukh Nagar in Haryana.
- Solar energy system fitted in DEMU train would result in saving 5.25 lakh litres of diesel per train over 25 years. It will also help in reducing 1350 tons of carbon dioxide (CO2) per train over 25 years.
- 70. Indian Railways launched Rail SAARTHI (*synergised advanced application rail travel help and information*) mobile application to cater to various passenger requirements including ticket booking, inquiry, on-board cleaning and ordering meal on a single platform.
- 71. Indian Railways launched RailCloud, a virtual server with an inbuilt security system that will enable faster connectivity at a reduced cost.
- RailCloud works on Cloud Computing system, an emerging technology for faster and on demand commensurate deployment of server resources which results in reduced cost.
- RailCloud has been developed by rail PSU RailTel as part of Railways strategic IT initiative, IR—OneICT.
- NIVARAN (Grievance Portal) Became First IT application to be hosted on RailCloud.
- Cashless treatment Scheme in Emergency (CTSE) also launched to provide Comprehensive Health Care Facilities through inhouse health Institutions, supplementing with referrals to recognized hospitals whenever necessar.
- 72. Indian city of Ahmedabad (Gujarat) has been declared as India's first World Heritage City by UNESCO, recognising heritage value of walled city's unique heritage.
- 73. Indian government will organize a global food fair in Delhi in November as *World Food India 2017*, to provide a platform to Indian farmers and manufacturers to showcase their products and explore partnerships with foreign companies.
- 74. Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) announced exemption of fees for its transgender students of all programmes.
- 75. International Migration Outlook report 2017 released by Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD).

- 76. Jammu and Kashmir Government Hosted first ever 'Cultrue of Cruise' cultural programme at Dal Lake (Srinagar), aimed to bring artists from various fields on one stage.
- 77. Jharkhand CM Raghubar Das inaugurated India's largest fresh water aquarium *Ranchi Machchli Ghar* in Ranchi. It is spread in over 36,000 sq feet area with 58 fish tanks.
- 78. Karnataka government launched *Elevate 100* scheme to identify and nurture innovative start-ups. It aims to identify 100 most innovative start-ups in state and elevate them to higher success.
- 79. Karnataka hosted International Conference on *Reclaiming Social Justice, Revisiting Ambedkar* to mark 126th birth Anniversary of B R Ambedkar.
- 80. Kerala Government launched *G-Ride* app as a digital ride sharing platform. It will aim at bringing down number of vehicles used by people.
- 81. Kerala government will set up stray dog zoos to keep them off streets in the State.
- 82. Kerala hosted 5th edition of South India Writers Ensemble (SIWE) literary festival with tolerance as core theme.
- 83. Lok Sabha passed *Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (Amendment) Bill 2017* to amend *Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act (RTE) 2009* to extend deadline for teachers to acquire minimum qualifications for appointment. Inadequately qualified teachers as on March 31 2015, working after enactment of RTE Act 2009 will have to acquire minimum qualifications by March 31, 2019 to hold their jobs as teachers.
- 84. Lok Sabha passed Indian Institute of Information Technology Public Private Partnership (IIIT-PPP) Bill 2017 to allow 15 IIITs established on a PPP model to grant degrees and get statutory status. IIITs will also be given status of *Institute of National Importance*, Like IITs and NITs.
- Government initiated opening 20 IIITs with private partnership of which 15 are already operational, at Cost of INR 128 crores each. Centre contributed 50% of amount, states 35% and private partners remaining 15%.
- 85. Lok Sabha passed Indian Institutes of Management (IIM) Bill 2017 to -
- Declares IIMs as institutions of national importance and empower these institutions to attain standards of global excellence in management, management research and allied areas of knowledge.
- It also grants complete administrative, academic and financial autonomy to these B-Schools and allow them to grant degrees.
- 86. Madhya Pradesh's school education department is implementing *Hamari Shala Kaisi Ho* and *Shala Siddhi Karyakram* in all government schools of the state in order to provide qualitative education to students.
- 87. Madras High Court ruled that Vande Mataram should be sung in all schools and colleges across Tamil Nadu atleast once in a week and in government and private offices atleast once in a month.
- 88. Maharashtra become first state to provide women an injectable contraceptive for free, Medroxyprogesterone acetate (a birthcontrol hormone).
- 89. Maharashtra government approved revised *Majhi Kanya Bhagyashree* scheme that benefits families with yearly income under INR 7.5 lakh. It aims at improving skewed girl child ratio in state and was launched by state government on April 1, 2016 in place of 'Sukanya' scheme.
- 90. Maharashtra state government will create cycle tracks through'streets with cycle track project to encourage use of bicycles, to ease congestion and reduce air pollution.
- 91. Maharashtra's women commission signed agreement with United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) for rescue and rehabilitation of women who are victims of sex trafficking, acid attack and domestic violence.
- 92. Manipur Government declared present Flood situation in State as a Severe State Calamity.
- 93. Meghalaya Government launched flagship program *Livelihood Intervention and Facilitation of Entrepreneurship* (LIFE), aiming at state's 2144 villages in 2017 18. It will focus on capacity building of SHGs (Self-Help Groups).
- 94. Microsoft launched *Kaizala* productivity designed to enhance collaboration and communication experience for Indian enterprises. It will enable organizations to interact with people within organization and outside like partners and vendors more conveniently.
- 95. Microsoft signed an agreement with National Independent Schools Alliance (NISA) to offer Microsoft Aspire School Program (MASP) Pro Plus to over 55,000 member schools in India. It aims to equip schools with technology and innovative learning solutions.
- 96. Minister for Housing and Urban Affairs M Venkaiah Naidu released new version of National Housing Bank's NHB RESIDEX, that captures movements in prices of residential real estate prices.
- 97. Minister of Science & Technology, Earth Sciences and Environment, Forests & Climate Change *Harshvardhan* launched 2 useful apps on occasion of Foundation Day of Ministry of Earth Sciences.
- Sagar Vani app -
- It will provide ocean information services of ESSO-Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS) directly to end user, to remove delay in dissemination of valuable information.

- India Quake App -
- It will provide Earthquakes related information compiled by National Centre for Seismology (NCS) directly to end user, to remove delay in dissemination of valuable information. It will also help in reducing panic amongst people during an earthquake. For example, if an earthquake occurs in Afghanistan and is strongly felt in Delhi, then people in Delhi will know in less than 2 minutes that earthquake has actually occurred in Afghanistan and not in Delhi.
- 98. Minister of State for Home Kiren Rijiju inaugurated Research Institution of World Ancient, Traditional, Culture & Heritage (RIWATCH) Museum at Roing in Arunachal Pradesh.
- 99. Minister of State for Minority Affairs (IC) & Parliamentary Affairs Shri Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi inaugurated first Gharib Nawaz Skill Development Centre in Hyderabad (Telangana) -
- Government will establish Garib Nawaz Skill Development Centres in 100 districts of country, aimed at implying employability skills in youth belonging to Minority communities.
- 100. Ministry of AYUSH has constituted a National Board for Promotion and Development of Yoga & Naturopathy (NBPDYN) for regulation of education & practice of Yoga & Naturopathy.
- 101. Ministry of Health and Family Welfare released Operational Guidelines for Planning and Implementation of Family Participatory Care (FPC) for improving newborn health.
- FPC is an important concept of health care as it provides partnership between health care staff and families in care of sick newborns admitted in Special Newborn Care Units (SNCU). FPC are needed as Sick and newborn are highly vulnerable and require careful nurturing in order to survive neonatal period and first year of life.
- 102. Ministry of Health and Family Welfare signed MOU with Government of West Bengal to to set up a state-of-the-art Centre of Excellence in Transfusion Medicine at Kolkata.
- 103. Ministry of Housing and Urban Development approved construction of 30,000 affordable houses in Maharashtra's Sholapur district for urban poor on private land under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Urban). It is first such project to be taken up on private land under PMAY(U).
- Earlier approved projects for affordable housing projects were built on lands belonging to state government / municipal corporations.
- 104. Ministry of Power launched a portal for optimum utilization of domestic coal by independent power producer (IPP), that would estimatedly save the consumer close to Rs. 20,000 crore in 5 years.
- 105. Ministry of Rural Development will launch Aajeevika Grameen Express Yojana (AGEY), a sub-scheme under Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM). AGEY aims to provide alternative source of livelihood to members of Self Help Groups (SHGs) by facilitating them to operate public transport services in backward rural areas.
- 106. Ministry of Science & Technology launched National Biopharma Mission as first ever Industry-Academia mission to accelerate biopharmaceutical development in India. Under this mission, ministry also launched Innovate in India (i3) program to create an enabling ecosystem to promote entrepreneurship and indigenous manufacturing in sector.
- Innovate in India (i3) program i3 is a flagship program of India that will witness an investment of \$250 million with \$125 million as a loan from world Bank. It is committed to make India a hub for design and development of novel, affordable and effective biopharmaceutical products and solutions.
- It will strive to increase India's global biopharmaceutical market share from current 2.8% to 5%.
- 107. Ministry of Women and Child Development launched an online patform 'SHe-box (Sexual Harassment Electronic Box) to enable women employees of the Central government to file complaints related to sexual harassment at work place.
- 108. Minority Affairs Ministry has launched Jiyo Parsi Publicity Phase-2 in Mumbai, aimed at containing declining population of Parsi communityin India.
- 109. Mumbai Metro launched India's first Mobile Ticketing System 'OnGo' which will help commuters pass the AFC gates using their mobile phones.
- Additionally, Lucknow metro will be India's first metro network to offer free drinking water and toilet facilities and will have its own FM radio station.
- 110. NITI (National Institution for Transforming India) Aayog approved 6 transport proposals of transport ministry to improve public transport. It includes high-tech mass rapid transportation technologies such as *metrino*, *hyperloop*, *pod taxis*, *stadler buses*, *hybrid buses* and *freight rail road*.
- 111. NITSER (National Institutes of Technology, Science Education and Research) Amendment Bill has been passed in Rajya Sabha, to introduce 2 new Institutions namely Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER) Tirupati and IISER Berhampur in Second Schedule of NITSER Act 2007.

- 112. Nagaland has been declared as *disturbed area* for 6 more months under Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act (AFSPA), which empowers security forces to conduct operations anywhere without any prior notice to civil administration.
- 113. National Aluminium Company Limited (NALCO) and Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation (IDCO) launched a joint venture company to set up an aluminium park at Angul (Odisha) with Investment of INR 180 crores. Odisha currently contributes about 54% of India's total aluminium smelting capacity.
- 114. National Book Trust (NBT) launched Har Haath Ek Kitaab (One Book for Every Hand) scheme, that allows people to make donations to children between age 6 12 in the form of books with a simple method. NBT has tied up with e Commerce site Smapdeal for this purpose.
- 115. National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) launched its own *quality mark* logo for dairy products in country, aimed at bringing improvement in entire value chain from producer to the consumer to ensure availability of safe and quality of milk and products.
- 116. National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) conducted national-level Conference on Crowd Management at Thiruvananthapuram in Kerala.
- 117. National Green Tribunal (NGT) declared 100 metres from edge of the Ganga river between Haridwar and Unnao as "No- Development Zone".
- 118. National Green Tribunal (NGT) imposed nationwide ban on use of kite strings (manja), made of nylon or any synthetic material, as it poses threat to animals and humans.
- 119. National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) in its 4th meeting approved 7 projects (worth approx 425 crores INR) in Uttar Pradesh and Bihar.
- 120. National Security Guard (NSG) organized First International Aviation Security Seminar in Manesar (Haryana).
- 121. New Delhi-based *The Energy Resources Institute (TERI)* is ranked 2nd among world's best climate think tank by International Centre for Climate Governance (ICCG) in category *2016 Top Climate Think Tanks in the Rest of the World Absolute Global Rankings*. It was announced during ICCG's 23rd annual conference of European Association of Environmental and Resource Economists (EAERE) in Athens (Greece).
- 122. Odisha CM Naveen Patnaik dedicated to nation the state's longest bridge and named it after Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. The 2.88 km bridge connects Barang on outskirts of Bhubaneswar with Judicial Academy Chhak in Cuttack.
- Odisha Governmwnr will also set up an international standard sports city in state.
- 123. Odisha CM Naveen Patnaik inaugurated computerisation of PACS (Primary Agricultural Cooperative Socities) and launched RuPay Kisan Credit cards.
- Odisha is first state to implement an integrated Core Banking Solution Project for farmers, to ensure transparency. It will cover all 3 tiers of short term cooperative credit structure state cooperative bank, district central cooperative banks and 2,708 primary agriculture cooperative societies.
- 124. PM Narendra Modi inaugurated Textiles India 2017 as India's first ever mega textiles trade fair at Gandhinagar (Gujarat). This 3 day fair will aims to showcase India as a global sourcing hub and investment destination for manufacturers world-wide.
- 125. PM Narendra Modi inaugurated a memorial for former Indian President A P J Abdul Kalam at his birthplace near Rameswaram (Tamilnadu).
- 126. Parliament passed *Collection of Statistics (Amendment) Bill 2017* after it was approved by Rajya Sabha. It amends Collection of Statistics Bill 2008 that facilitates collection of statistics related to social, economic, demographic, scientific and environmental aspects by central, state and local governments. Changes are -
- Bill extends jurisdiction of the parent act to the state of Jammu and Kashmir for collection of statistics.
- It adds provisions for appointment of a nodal officer by government, who will coordinate statistical activities.
- The Bill removes provision dealing with information collected under it only is used for statistical purposes and allows government to determine manner in which such information collected will be used for statistical purposes.
- 127. President Pranab Mukherjee approved Maharashtra Prohibition of People from Social Boycott (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Bill, 2016. Maharashtra is first state to formulate a law to punish social boycott.
- 128. President Pranab Mukherjee approved a bill banning hookah bars in Gujarat, provisioning max Jail term of 3 years for violators.
- 129. President Pranab Mukherjee approved promulgation of *The Prevention of cruelty to Animals (Karnataka Amendment) Ordinance, 2017* by Governor of Karnataka in pursuance of Article 213 of Constitution.
- It now legalises Kambala, bullock cart races and bull runs as traditional sports involving animals and exempt them from *Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960*.
- 130. President Pranab Mukherjee dedicated BML Munjal University to nation.

- BML Munjal University (BMU) is based in Haryana. It was founded by promoters of Hero Group and is named after group's chairman and founder Brij Mohan Lall Munjal.
- 131. President Pranab Mukherjee launched 2 programmes to take education to remote areas with help of technology Swayam and Swayam Prabha.
- Under Swayam, courses would be offered through digital classrooms with online study material available free of cost in videos
- SWAYAM Prabha is set of 32 DTH channels operationalised for telecasting high quality educational content free of charge using the GSAT-15 satellite transponders.
- Prez also launched a *National Academic Depository* where verified educational records would be digitally stored by universities or a board to counter forgery. National Digital Library is also launched as large online library containing 6.5 million books.
- Prez also inaugurated *Ashiana Annexe* In Dehradun (Uttarakhand), comprising 12 low cost dwelling units to accommodate officers and staff of Rashtrapati Bhavan during Presidential visits to Retreat at 'Ashiana'.
- 132. Punjab Government approved new transport policy that abolishes system of district transport officers (DTO) and restructures transport department. A special task force has been set up and the state police to crack down on all illegall buses. Permits will be valid for a 5 years from date of issue.
- 133. Punjab Government launched flagship *care companion health scheme*, aiming to improve patient outcomes through better family engagement and education.
- 134. Punjab government launched *Apni Gaddi Apna Rozgar* scheme by flagging off over 100 uber MOTO bikes. Under this, state government will provide commercial two wheelers and four wheelers to unemployed youth at subsidized rates.
- 135. Rail Land Development Authority (RLDA) signed MoU with National Building Construction Corporation (NBCC) for redevelopment of 10 railway stations on global standards Tirupati, Nellore, Puducherry, Sarai Rohilla (Delhi), Madgaon, Lucknow, Gomtinagar, Kota, Thane (New) and Ernakulam. A Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) will be formed as a Joint Venture (JV) company between RLDA and NBCC on 50:50 basis.
- 136. Raipur's Swami Vivekananda Airport ranked first in Customer Satisfaction among 49 airports in country with score of 4.84 score out of 5. Raipur airport is followed by Udaipur, Amritsar and Dehradun airports.
- 137. Rajasthan became first State to set minimum educational qualifications for contesting elections to village cooperative societies and various other cooperative bodies, amending State Cooperative Societies Rules 2003.
- Required educational qualifications Class 5 to 8th for members of governing boards of various cooperative societies, 8th for primary committee members, 10th for district-level committees and graduation for state level committees.
- Rajasthan will also be first state to establish Recruitment Board by Cooperative Committees, to ensure more and efficient employment in cooperatives.
- 138. Rajya Sabha passed Admiralty (Jurisdiction and Settlement of Maritime Claims) Bill 2017 that repeals laws such as Admiralty Court Act 1861 and Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act 1890. It was passed by Lok Sabha in March 2017.
- 139. Rashtriya Ispat Nigam Limited and Cement Corporation of India signed MOU to set up 2 MTPA (Million Tonnes Per Annum) Fly Ash and Blast Furnace Slag based Cement Plant in Vishakhapatnam (Andhra Pradesh) as a Joint Venture in 2 phases of 1 million tonne capacity each.
- 140. Reliance Jio Infocomm launched Asia-Africa-Europe (AAE-1) submarine cable system as world's longest 100 Gbps technologybased submarine system. It stretches over 25,000km from Marseille (France) to Hong Kong, with 21 cable landings across Asia and Europe.
- A submarine cable system is a cable system that consists of telecom and internet cables, which are laid on the seabed between land-based stations. These cables carry telecommunication and data signals across stretches of oceans.
- AAE-1 is a combination of leading telecom service providers from Europe, Middle East and Asia. It will link with other cable systems and fibre networks to deliver direct access to all global markets.
- 141. Road Transport & Highways and Shipping Ministry announced assistance of INR 200 crores to assam for repairs of National Highways damaged due to heavy rains and INR 400 Crores for dredging work in Brahmaputra river.
- 142. Scientists from Geological Survey of India (GSI) discovered presence of millions of tonnes of precious metals and minerals deep under waters within the Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) of peninsular India. GSI for first time has identified huge presence of marine resources off Mangaluru, Mannar Basin, Chennai, Andaman and Nicobar Islands.
- 143. State government of Madhya Pradesh appointed a four-member food commission headed by Rajkishore Swain, in accordance with National Food Security Act (NFSA) 2013. It has came in line with supreme court's recent announcement that National Food Security (NFS) Act 2013 has not been implemented properly and has been postponed by various states.

- 144. Student- scientist connect programme *Jigyasa* has been officially launched in Delhi, jontly by Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS).
- 145. Supreme Court allowed Government to replace oversight committee set up to supervise functioning of Medical Council of India (MCI) with a fresh panel of five eminent doctors.
- Oversight committee was set up by SC in May 2016 to oversee MCl's functioning. It was led by former Chief Justice R.M. Lodha.
- 146. Supreme Court asked Union government to formalise appointment of election commissioners through law.
- SC stated that there is expectation in Constitution that Election Commissioners, who are charged with important duty of conducting free and fair elections must be appointed through a process formalised by a law enacted by Parliament.
- At present, there is no transparency in the eligibility, criteria required for a person to be appointed as an election commissioner.
- 147. Supreme Court exempted Arunachal Pradesh and Andaman and Nicobar Islands from ban on sale of liquor within 500 metres of National and State Highways.
- 148. Supreme Court imposed ban on use of 5 harmful heavy metals *lithium, antimony, mercury, arsenic and lead* in manufacturing firecrackers due to air pollution caused by them.
- 149. Supreme Court ruled that police cannot arrest accused family without conducting a preliminary inquiry under dowry harassment cases filed under Section 498A of Indian Penal Code (IPC), in view of misuse of anti-dowry harassment law framed in 1983.
- 150. Supreme Court will set up a nine-judge bench to decide whether *Right to Privacy* in India can be defined as a fundamental right under Constitution or not.
- 151. Telangana government imposed a cap on weight of bags carried by school children in order to prevent any physical disorders.

- Class 1 & 2 => 1.5 kg

- 152. Telangana government launched grievances redressal portal called *Janahitha*, as a fast and single window facility for all public grievances.
- 153. Telangana will be First Indian state to have eco-friendly bridges for easy movement of tigers, over a canal cutting across tiger corridor linking Tadoba-Andhari Tiger Reserve (TATR) in the Chandrapur district of Maharashtra with forests in Telangana's Kumram Bheem Asifabad district.
- 154. Telangana will be first state to build India's first university exclusively for Dalit students in 2018.
- 155. Telangana will present a separate agriculture budget for state from next year (2018 19), aiming to boost Agriculture sector with more focus and funds.
- 156. UP Government launched Uttar Pradesh Real Estate Regulatory Authority (UP RERA) website http://www.up rera.in, putting details of all real estate projects and builders in public domain and accessible for all.
- 157. Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) launched *mAadhaar* mobile application for syncing Aadhaar data on mobile phones. It will allow users to carry their unique Aadhaar information including name, DOB, address, linked photograph etc. on their smartphones. App will also allow users to lock or unlock biometrics data.
- 158. Uttar Pradesh Government launched free power connection scheme for BPL card holders in state, initially at 624 places.
- 159. Uttar Pradesh Government re-named Kanpur and Bareilly airports after freedom fighter Ganesh Shanker Vidyarthi and as Nath Nagri respectively.
- 160. Uttar Pradesh Government will launch 'Pink' air-conditioned buses installed with CCTV cameras exclusively for women, with all women staff.

- 8. China's Noted political prisoner and Nobel laureate Liu Xiaobo passed away. Liu was awarded the 2010 Nobel Peace Prize for his non-violent struggle for fundamental human rights in China.
- 9. Famous blue-bordered sari of Mother Teresa, who has been canonized as Saint Teresa of Calcutta by Vatican, has been recognized as an Intellectual Property of the Missionaries of Charity. This is the first time that a uniform has been made the intellectual property.
- 10. Former Karnataka Chief Minister N. Dharam Singh passed away.
- 11. Former Noted Australian Tennis player Mervyn Rose passed away.
- 12. Former Sikkim Chief Minister Nar Bahadur Bhandari passes away.
- 13. Google CEO Sundar Pichai joined board of directors of Alphabet, Google's parent company. Pichai has efficiently led Google for past 2 years.
- 14. Julie Bishop, Foreign Minister of Australia Visited India.
- 15. Navy Chief Sunil Lanba began 8 day tour of african nations Mozambique and Tanzania.
- 16. Noted Freedom fighter K.E. Mammen passed away.
- 17. Noted Iranian Mathematician Maryam Mirzakhani passed away. She was only woman to receive Field Medal (equivalent of Nobel Prize for mathematics).
- 18. Noted Marathi actor-writer Madhukar Toradmal passed away.
- 19. Noted space scientist and former Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) Chairman Udupi Ramachandra Rao passed away. He contributed to development and launch of India's First satellite Aryabhatta.
- 20. Oscar Winning American Actor Martin Landau passed away. He won oscar award for Ed Wood in 1994.
- 21. Pham Binh Minh, Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister of Vietnam visited India.
- 22. Renowned Indian Scientist Professor Yash Pal passed away, Known for his contributions to study of cosmic rays. He was awarded Padma Bhushan in 1976 and Padma Vibhushan in 2013.
- 23. Renowned cartoonist Mangesh Tendulkar passed away.
- 24. Tharman Shanmugaratnam, Deputy Prime Minister of Singapore Visited India to attend Delhi Economics Conclave 2017.
- 25. Toronto Film Festival (Canada) will honour Priyanka Chopra in event to be held in September 2017. It will aim at collecting funds to be used for helping fund talent development programs to get more women behind and in front of the camera.
- 26. U Min Aung Hlaing, Chief of Myanmar Defence Services Visited India.
- 27. UAE Minister of State for Tolerance *Sheikha Lubna Al Qasimi* has been named most powerful Arab women in government for 2017.
- 28. UNICEF appointed Indian- origin Canadian Lilly Singh as its newest Global Goodwill Ambassador.
- 29. Ustad Hussain Sayeeduddin Dagar, noted expert of Dhrupad tradition of Hindustani classical music passed away.
- 30. Yarub Qudah (Industry and Trade Minister of Jordan) Visited India for 10th India-Jordan Trade and Economic Joint Committee (TEJC) Meeting held in New Delhi.
- 31. Yesteryear actress Madhubala became latest to join Bollywood celebrities whose wax figures will be set up at Madame Tussauds Museu to be open in late 2017 in Delhi Regal Building.

Science

- 1. Canadian scientists identified a new bird-like species of dinosaur that lived nearly 71 million years ago and was about the size of a person. It has been named as the Albertavenator curriei, in honour of famous Canadian palaeontologist Philip J. Currie.
- 2. A group of scientists started a new expedition aimed at unlocking secrets of lost continent 'Zealandia', which is mostly submerged and believed to have sunk after breaking away from Australia 60 85 million years ago.
- Expedition is called Expedition 371 and is funded by National Science Foundation and the International Ocean Discovery Program.
- Team includes over 30 scientists aboard JOIDES Resolution, a massive scientific drilling ship. Duration of trip will be approx 2 months.
- 3. According to study at University of Hyderabad, Castor bean plants can prove very useful in fighting soil pollution as these plants can absorb toxic heavy metals from soil from these polluted areas due to industrial pollution.

- 4. An Australian Researchers discovered a new species of giant ocean sunfish, heaviest type of bony fish that can weigh over two tonnes and grow to 3 metres long. It has been named as hoodwinker (mola tecta).
- 5. India's 2nd and Tamil Nadu's First Zika Virus Case has been reported (First in Ahmedabad in May 2017).
- Zika virus is vector borne disease transmitted primarily by Aedes aegypti mosquitoes, same mosquito that transmits dengue. It is also sexually transmissible. It can cause serious birth defects Including neurological disorders and foetal deformation (Microcephaly) in which infants are born with abnormally smaller heads.
- 6. Indian astronomers fro Pune Based Inter University Centre for Astronomy and Astrophysics (IUCAA) and Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER) identified extremely large supercluster of galaxies located in the direction of constellation Pisces, named as *Saraswati*. Saraswati supercluster is 4 billion light years away from Earth and may contain mass equivalent of 20 million billion suns.
- 7. India's first dedicated space observatory AstroSat along with Chandra and Hubble Space Telescope have detected a massive coronal explosion on Proxima Centauri, sun's closest star neighbour.
- 8. Ministry of Science and Technology launched SOHUM, an indigenously developed low-cost hearing screening device for newborns. It has been developed by School of International Biodesign (SIB) startup *Sohum Innovation Labs India*. Sohum aims to minimise or reverse hearing loss damage and uses brain-stem auditory evoked response.
- 9. NASA is developing Double Asteroid Redirection Test (DART) as first-ever mission that will deflect a near-Earth asteroid, to be built and managed by John Hopkins Applied Physics Laboratory (APL).
- It will work on kinetic impactor technique, that involves sending one or more large, high-speed spacecraft into path of an approaching near-earth object to shift its orbit to defend against future impact.
- Target for DART is an asteroid called Didymos that will have a distant approach to Earth in October 2022 and then again in 2024. Asteroid Didymos (Greek word for twin) is an asteroid binary system that consists of Didymos A (780 metres), and Didymos B (160 metres).
- 10. NASA's Juno spacecraft became first space probe to successfully comlete a flyby into Jupiter's giant storm known as Great Red Spot.
- Great Red Spot on Jupiter is a massive storm (cyclone) measuring about 16,000 km in diameter. It is largest known storm in solar system.
- 11. NASA's New Horizons spacecraft unveiled a set of new maps of Pluto and its largest moon Charon on occassion of 2 year anniversary of its flyby around Pluto.
- 12. Researchers at Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER) Kolkata have developed an organic inorganic hybrid material which is fire and rust resistant. It was synthesised by combining polyhedral oligomeric silsesquioxane (POSS) and diphenylalanine.
- 13. Researchers at UK's Cardiff University have produced world's most detailed scan of brain's internal wiring -
- Scan shows fibres in white matter called axons (brain's wiring which carry billions of electrical signals).
- Scan showed direction of messaging and also density of brain's wiring.
- This detailed scan of brain's wiring will help increase understanding of a range of neurological disorders and can be used instead of invasive biopsies.
- 14. Researchers at University of Edinburgh (UK) stated that surface of Mars has chemical compounds called perchlorates that can kill bacteria, when exposed to ultraviolet (UV) light. This has given a blow to hopes of finding alien life on surface of Mars.
- 15. Researchers discovered a very distant galaxy, which is over 1000 times brighter than our Milky Way Galaxy. To measure this galaxy, researchers used Gran Telescopio Canarias (GTC) in Spain.
- 16. Researchers from San Antonio Catholic University of Spain discovered novobiocin compound that could be used as a potential drug to fight Zika virus infection. Researchers found that novobiocin compound shown phenomenal recovery results in mice with 100 % cure rate.
- It was also found that commonly used malaria drug *hydroxychloroquine* can block Zika virus from crossing placenta and getting into the foetus and damaging its brain.
- 17. Researchers in UK produced specific human antibodies in laboratory by treating patient-derived B cells with tiny nanoparticles coated with both CpG oligonucleotides and an antigen, paving way for rapid development of new vaccines to treat a wide range of infectious diseases.
- 18. Scientists at Purdue University in USA (including Karthik Ramani of India) have developed new artificial intelligence (AI) software called *SurfNet* that can create three dimensional (3D) models from 2D photographs. It can be of great use in robotics, object recognition and even self-driving cars.
- 19. Scientists discovered new species of glow-in-the-dark shark living 1,000 feet below Pacific Ocean off coast of northwestern Hawaiian islands. It is named Etmopterus lailae and belongs to lanternshark family.

- 20. Scientists from Cornell University (USA) announced that world's 6 smallest spacecrafts dubbed as Sprites ever launched are successfully travelling in low Earth orbit and communicating with systems on Earth.
- Sprites were launched on June 23, 2017 by Indian rocket Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV) as part of Breakthrough Starshot project designed to test technologies that would eventually be used for interstellar missions. These are smallest spacecrafts to establish contact with ground stations. Sprites are built on a single 3.5*3.5 centimeter circuit board and weigh 4 grams each.
- Breakthrough Starshot space program is launched under US \$100 million Breakthrough Initiatives, announced by Yuri Milner and Stephen Hawking to develop and launch practical interstellar space missions. It aims to demonstrate proof of concept for light-propelled spacecraft that could fly at 20 % of light speed. Its main objective is to send one-gram chips to star systems beyond the solar system in search of extraterrestrial intelligence.
- 21. Scientists from ETH Zurich in Switzerland developed a 3D-printed soft silicone heart that closely resembles and functions like human organ. It is not exact biological replica of actual, but can help to save lives of people who suffer from cardiac failure.
- 22. Scientists from Indian Institute of Science, Education and Research (IISER) Thiruvananthapuram have developed gelator that can suck up oil and congeal it. Gelator is a hydrophobic material with property of oleilophilic (oil-loving) and takes up oil when it comes in contact with it. It can be used to recover marine oil spills with a simple, efficient and cost effective method.
- 23. Scientists from NASA for first time will chase shadow of moon using two of NASA's WB-57F research jets during upcoming total solar eclipse in USA, to capture clearest ever images of Sun's outer atmosphere (Corona).
- It is needed as Corona of sun (gaseous envelope surrounding sun) is heated to millions of degrees, but lower atmospheric layers like photosphere are only heated at a few thousand degrees.
- Total solar eclipse will provide rare opportunity for scientists to study the sun's atmosphere. During this eclipse, moon will completely cover the sun and perfectly blocking its light so that faint corona is easily seen against dark sky.
- 24. Scientists from New Zealand claimed that vaccine can protect against the sexually transmitted infection gonorrhoea. They found that Men B jab vaccine originally developed to stop an outbreak of meningitis B can protect from gonorrhoea.
- 25. Scientists from Northwestern University (USA) created miniature versions of Saturn, complete with rings, by electrifying tiny droplets of fluids.
- When a drop of electrically conductive liquid is exposed to an electric field, droplet formes two electrically charged poles that can get pulled towards sources of electric field, taking on cone shapes. If pull is strong enough, tips of the cones can spray jets of droplets. This effect is known as electrospraying.
- 26. Scientists from Oregon Health and Science University (USA) successfully edited genes of human embryos to correct defective DNA that cause inherited diseases, using CRISPR-Cas9 genome editing technology to alter human DNA in single-cell embryos, which allows specific sections of DNA to be altered or replaced.
- 27. Scientists from Physikalisch-Technische Bundesanstalt (PTB) in Germany developed world's Most sharpe and Precise laser, that can be useful for various applications such as optical atomic clocks, radioastronomy, precision spectroscopy, testing theory of relativity and carry out new precision measurements on ultracold atoms.
- Theoretically, laser light has only 1 colour, wavelength or frequency. In reality, however, there is always a certain linewidth. This newly developed laser has linewidth of only 10 miliHertz (0.01 Hz), closer to ideal laser than ever before.
- 28. Scientists from USA's Harvard Medical School for first time encoded a small movie clip in DNA of living bacterial cells and then played it back. They used CRISPR gene-editing technique to encode and retrieve reconstructed frames of a classic 1870s racehorse in motion sequence of photos into genome of common bacteria *E. coli*. Film stored in DNA of bacteria was also well preserved and was intact even in new generation of bacteria.
- 29. Scientists from USA's Harvard University have developed a super strong, flexible adhesive material inspired by glue secreted by slugs that sticks to biological tissues without causing toxicity. It is biocompatible and binds to tissues with a strength comparable to the body's own resilient cartilage.
- 30. Scientists from University of Cambridge (UK) developed super-stretchy and strong artificial (synthetic) spider silk, almost entirely (98 %) composed of water. Spider silk is one of strongest materials for applications such as making eco friendly textiles and sensors.
- 31. Scientists from University of Cambridge (UK) spotted smallest star discovered so far, named as EBLM J0555-57Ab.
- It was identified by SuperWASP, a planet-finding experiment run by several universities. EBLM J0555-57Ab is located about 600 light years away and is slightly larger than Saturn in size.
- It is as small as stars can possibly become as it has just enough mass to enable the fusion of hydrogen nuclei into helium at its centre.

- 32. Tata Motors unveiled India's first Bio-CNG (bio-methane) bus at *Urja Utsav* bio-energy programme organised by Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas.
- Biomethane is a naturally occurring gas which is produced by anaerobic digestion of organic matter such as dead animal and plant material, manure, sewage, organic waste, etc.
- 33. University of Hyderabad and IIT Bombay stated that extreme El Nino conditions and warming of Bay of Bengal had resulted in unprecedented heavy rainfall in Chennai between November 30th to December 2nd in 2015.
- El Nino causes less than normal rainfall in case of south-west monsoon but does reverse in case of the northeast monsoon.

- 15. Former Indian Cricketer Sandeep Patil has named as brand ambassador of Indian Indoor Cricket Team for 10th World Indoor Cricket Federation (WICF) World Cup to be held in September 2017 in Dubai.
